Article 2

Membership

SECTION 1. There shall be five types of memberships open for application to all persons who subscribe to the purpose of this organization. The members shall be grouped as follows:

- (a) Charter
- (b) Honorary
- (c) Active
- (d) Inactive
- (e) Senior

Only the Active and Senior members shall be eligible for office or a right to vote.

SECTION 2. Charter Members-Charter members shall be those persons having attended the Charter Meeting and Seminar of this Association held October 13th and 14th, 1962 at Bethany, Connecticut.

SECTION 3. Honorary Members – Distinguished persons of long standing and devotion to the objectives of this Association, not to exceed two (2) in number each year, may be elected to Honorary Membership in the Association upon two-thirds vote by the members present at the Annual Meeting. The nominations must be submitted to the Trustees in writing at least four (4) months in advance of the next Annual Meeting for consideration and presentation to the membership.

SECTION 4. Active Members – There shall be two (2) types as follows:

- (a) Departmental subscribers with duly authorized representation.
- (b) Individual memberships open to those who shall meet the basic qualifications as set forth on the application blank for membership and by virtue of the Association and cooperation with duly authorized law enforcement agencies or search and rescue units.
- (c) For the purposes of this Article and Section, “search and rescue units” as stated in paragraph (b) of this Section 4 shall mean any search and rescue unit attached to, recognized by any Federal, State, County or local agency possessing the authority to conduct search and rescue operations within the jurisdiction in which the search and rescue applicant maintains its permanent base of operations or office. Applications by the search and rescue units must be accompanied by a letter of verification from the chief, administrator, etc. of the department having that authority.

SECTION 5. Inactive Member – Any active member in good standing, who for either political, transfer, or departmental reassignment reasons, is no longer able to qualify for Active membership, be classified as an Inactive Member without payment of dues.

Inactive membership shall be effected immediately upon notification to the Secretary of the change of status, by the concerned member. Inactive member changes to Inactive status due to the aforementioned reasons and said member is at the time a duly elected officer in the Association, the vacancy will be filled in accordance with Article 3, Section 1, Par. 6.

SECTION 6. Senior Members – Senior Members shall consist of Active Members, who, on the basis of full retirement, shall have applied to and have been approved by the Trustees. Said members shall have all the privileges of Active Members but with no payment of dues.
